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#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

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**Eye Contact:** Immediately flush with clean, cool water for 15 minutes and if irritation persists, get medical attention.

**Skin Contact:** Immediately wash skin with soap and plenty of water while removing contaminated clothing, for at least 15 minutes. If irritation persists, get medical attention. Launder contaminated clothing before reuse.

**Inhalation:** Remove victim to fresh air. If individual experiences nausea, headache, dizziness, has difficulty in breathing or is cyanotic, seek medical attention. If not breathing, give artificial respiration via a suitable mechanical device such as a bag and mask. Do not use mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.

**Ingestion:** Do not induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with copious quantities of water first and get immediate medical attention. Drink several glasses of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If vomiting occurs, keep airways clear.

**Note to Physician:** There is no specific antidote. Treatment of overexposure should be directed at the control of symptoms and the clinical condition of the patient. Aspiration may cause lung damage. Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.

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#### 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES
